'Atlantis', Gayle Chong Kwan, 2009

'Atlantis' by Gayle Chong Kwan is a series of seven photographic works and an installation of the mythical city Atlantis, which explores the mythical underwater city. The work is created out of waste plastic and questions notions of waste, climate change and how this fits into our planning of cities and communal living.

Chong Kwan has re-created Atlantis out of carved semi-opaque used plastic food packaging, collected from people who live in London. The use of throwaway packaging is in contrast to the stories of the mythical city of splendour; of beautiful temples, embellished palaces, harbours and luscious vegetation, here brought to life in the intricately carved towers and citadels, which are both beautiful and sinister, by turns luminous and ghostly.

Chong Kwan's new work is based on developments in tourism, regeneration and urban planning. This pristine but soulless city echoes the modern day tourist destinations artificially created at speed with little care of the local ecosystems. Chong Kwan's Atlantis alludes to masterplanning projects, often controlled and overseen by the few, but ultimately affecting the many, whose needs they can sometimes fail to meet.

The discarded remains of Atlantis may also be found at the bottom of many of our rivers and seas, forming their own kinds of horrific waste cities or constructions. With premonitions of our rising water levels, questions surround whether we are creating or living in the Atlantis of the future.

The architecture of Atlantis is inspired by ideas of the lost city, whose beauty was unequalled but which vanished in a day. First described by Plato in around 360 BC, Atlantis was catastrophically buried under the sea, and an earthquake was unleashed onto the island, triggering the flood. Often treated as a literary device, Atlantis entered into the popular imagination in the 1880's. Expeditions continue to search in various sites for the remains of Atlantis.

Born Edinburgh 1973. Lives and works in London. Scottish/Chinese Mauritian. Holds a BA in Fine Art from Central Saint Martins College of Art, an MSc in Communications from Stirling University, and a BA in Politics and Modern History from Manchester University.

Gayle Chong Kwan works with photography, video, sound, installation, and performance. Her work is often context specific or involves people in rituals of exchange, such as food or trade, to explore ideas of history, the senses and memory. The personal and global politics of food, waste, tourism and masterplanning have been a major focus of Chong Kwan's work to date.
